A Goal In Sight!

One of the best things about being a Volunteer with Community Caregivers is that one meets so many interesting people. You are invited to read about three Neighbors whose vision impairment has brought them together as advocates, friends and part of the Interlakes Community Caregivers community.

Deb Moore was a summer visitor to the Lakes Region for many years. While working

in credit union data processing, she traveled to many locations to install new data systems and to train new users, a hectic pace she enjoyed. When Deb developed eye problems in 2005, she moved in with her parents who had retired to Sandwich. She underwent several surgeries to restore her sight while caring for her mother. In 2006 she voluntarily stopped driving because her vision was too limited for her to feel safe behind the wheel. Friends and family and Community Caregivers have provided rides for her for over ten years. Deb is profoundly grateful to each and every Volunteer and has found each one to be kind, generous and willing to help in any way. "Caring is a big part of what they do and it comes through loud and clear." Deb regularly participates in meetings for those with vision impairment and other disabilities with rides from Caregivers.

Tony Bonanno was another visitor to the Lakes Region, building a summer home on Moultonborough Neck in the 1970s. He was Maintenance Supervisor at Logan International Airport for twenty years, overseeing a large staff and multiple contractors before retiring to the area. Due to diabetic retinopathy, Tony lost most of his sight and struggled to deal with his new circumstances. Tony eventually met Ed Mesky (profile below) who helped him with computers and brought him to a meeting of the National Federation of the Blind which Tony joined in 2010. Tony became more than a member putting on the state convention for the past three years. He also was the Chapter President for the Lakes Region for five years. He learned about Community Caregivers from Ed, and has had several long distance rides to doctor's appointments in Boston as well as transportation to meetings and conferences. He appreciates the assistance that Caregivers provides and states that all the Volunteers are very nice and that he enjoys getting to know them on their long trips together.

Ed Mesky's name comes up frequently when discussing local and state resources for the vision impaired. Born in Brooklyn, NY, Ed eventually became the Chairman of the Physics Department at Belknap College. Due to a birth defect, Ed's vision was always limited. He lost his sight completely at the age of 35. After four unsuccessful operations to restore his sight, Ed went to St. Paul's Center for the Blind now known as the Carroll Center for the Blind in Massachusetts for fifteen weeks to learn Braille and how to complete the activities of daily living without his sight. Not deterred by his vision loss, Ed resumed teaching using audio textbooks and customized teaching materials. He also was an officer in the National Federation of the Blind and continues to serve on the Governor's Commission for Disabilities. An avid science fiction fan, Ed and his wife, Sandy, travel often to club conventions and Ed continues to publish an email newsletter on topics of interest to science fiction aficionados.

Executive Director's Message

"Very friendly drivers! All on time!" "Nice to have people who really care about others!" "I appreciate the time you all take away from your own lives...to make sure mine is satisfied and fulfilling...keep up the great work!"

These are some of the comments our Neighbors shared in a recent survey. Neighbors reported that, since receiving services from Interlakes Community Caregivers, they:

- Are more in control of their life: 86%

- Feel less of a burden to family and friends: 92%

- Are able to maintain or regain their independence: 85%

- Are able to go to medical appointments, the grocery store, run errands: 92%

- Don't hesitate to make necessary medical appointments: 92%

- Eat healthier meals: 84%

- Feel less anxious: 71%

- Feel more connected to people: 76%

Are happier: 82%

Survey responders were 100% satisfied with the Community Caregivers Program and felt that the program has met their expectations.

These positive outcomes show we are making a true and positive difference in our community and are fulfilling our Mission each and every day.
